Environment@rtp hosts 8th Electronics Recycling Day event for RTP Employees

Environment@rtp, a committee of the RTP Owners & Tenants Association, will host its eighth Electronics Recycling Day on Wednesday, April 30, 2008 for RTP employees to drop off unneeded electronics gear for donation and/or recycling. Additionally, employees may drop off mercury containing thermometers and thermostats. Since the first event was held over three years ago, the Environment@rtp committee has collected donations of used electronic equipment such as computers, stereos, cell phones, VCRs, and TVs, from nearly 4,000 RTP employees, amounting to 130 tons of recyclable material.

Global Electric Electronic Processing, Inc. (GEEP), the collection and processing contractor for the event, is a company dedicated to protecting the environment by recycling electronics in the most responsible manner. GEEP keeps used computer and telecom equipment out of local landfills by converting them back into commodities – good for future use and value, and never exporting e-waste to third world countries.

Additionally, computers that meet specifications will be repaired and refurbished by the Kramden Institute, Inc. and donated to less advantaged children in the Triangle. Cell phones will be donated to the Family Violence Prevention Center of Orange County.
